NEXT GENERATION INDUSTRY PARTNERSHIPS (NEXT GEN IPS)

Next Generation Industry Partnerships (Next Gen IPs) are regional industrial partnerships of businesses in a shared labor market. Each Next Gen IP works with economic development, education, workforce development, and community organizations to address the needs of the region's industry. Businesses participating in the partnerships benefit from networking and collaborating with others in their local industry and gaining access to tailored industry-specific resources.

WEDNETPA

The Workforce & Economic Development Network of Pennsylvania (WEDnetPA) is a DCED-funded workforce training program helping employers upgrade the skills, knowledge, and effectiveness of their current employees with essential skills and advanced technology training. PRE-APPRENTICESHIP AND APPRENTICESHIP GRANT PROGRAM

The Pre-Apprentice and Apprenticeship Grant Program (Apprenticeship Program) is a DCED-funded program and can be used to help cover the costs of the formal instruction or classroom requirements associated with registered apprenticeships. To qualify, businesses must register their apprenticeship program with the PA Department of Labor & Industry's Apprenticeship and Training Office.

MANUFACTURING PA TRAINING-TO-CAREER GRANT PROGRAM

The Manufacturing PA Training-to-Career grants for short-term work readiness programs support populations facing barriers to employment. Training programs must be developed with direct input by two or more partnering manufacturers and specifically address the skills missing in entry-level applicants for existing or near-future open positions. Upon completion, individuals who have successfully finished the training should be eligible for immediate employment. dced.pa.gov/pamtgc
